

A LETTER FROM 2020

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No one will ever forget the year 2020. Collectively we experienced the uncertainty and constantly shifting conditions of a pandemic amidst a major racial justice movement during one of the most politically divisive moments in history. We expect 2021 to be as precarious, if not more, but share hope for the vaccine to steer us from the pandemic's threat even as economic, environmental, and healthcare crises continue.

At Public Media Institute, we responded to the crisis by using our media platforms and infrastructure to document Chicagoans' creative responses to the pandemic. Shifting our resources and attention, we quickly launched the Quarantine Times publishing platform, presenting pressing new work by social justice workers, artists and thinkers. Together with the Quarantine Concert Series, we were able to provide opportunities and direct financial support to artists, musicians and members of our communities.

Using our resources and networks we initiated the Community Kitchen and Canteen to address immediate hunger and employment needs of our community and are proud to be able to expand the program further.

These efforts are a continuation of our mission to create, incubate, and sustain innovative cultural programming.

We want to thank everyone who has believed in and supported Public Media Institute over the past (almost 20) years, allowing us to grow into the position to do our part to help Chicago weather this storm. Without our community of friends, family and partners we would not be able to respond and react to these guarantine times.

This report is an overview of our activities in 2020 and features collaborations with hundreds of artists and cultural workers of all stripes.

With your help we will expand upon our work and do everything we can to aid our communities through the rough years ahead.

Founded in 2001, PMI imagines the community of the future with artists, independent journalists, and our neighbors. Over the years, innumerable publications, festivals, spaces, and projects have been created by PMI. In 2020, PMI's primary programs included Lumpen Magazine, Lumpen Radio, Community Kitchen + Canteen, Co-Prosperity, Quarantine Times, and Buddy.

Lumpen Magazine

Since 1991, the arts, politics, and culture periodical Lumpen has distributed milions of free curculation magazines in Chicago and around the world.

Co-Prosperity

A 5000+ sq ft space that houses a visual arts gallery, performance space, publishing office, radio studio, and experimental cultural center.

Lumpen Radio

Launched in 2016, WLPN 105.5 FM broadcasts 24/7 community-generated and multilingual radio content and streams online at lumpenradio.com

Buddy

A shop at the Chicago Cultural Center selling Chicago-made goods and artwork. 100% of sales go to the artists. The shop is now online at hi-buddy.org

Quarantine Times

quarantinetimes.org features hundreds of creative responses to the crises of 2020, and will soon be published as a 500-page book.

Community Kitchen + Canteen

The Community Kitchen and the Community Canteen are food aid programs that provide over two-thousand meals a week to Chicagoans in need.

Neon Mike and Reuben Kincaid had 4 neon signs titled "I Can't" installed that said "I can't breathe, i can't watch birds, I can't jog, and I can't kneel" - which was vandalized in August by uknown actors.



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

In September, PMI staff along with the CoProsperity Programming Council decided to reopen the gallery space for the first time post 2020 pandemic. The space was open for individual scheduled visits and the staff took all the measures to ensure everyone's health and safety. "BEING: Welcome to Humanity" stares into the darkness of human reflection and unlocks a universe of emotion. Seven Chicago-based artists dive deep into the burden of sentience and bring their mental health stories to the table. Here; we are removing the varnish, manifesting the true self, and creating a place of comfort and understanding. Being will hurt and heal.

CO-PROSPERITY PEERS

Solo Exhibitions in the Co-Pro Windows

The Co-Prosperity Programming Council launched the Co-Pro Peers series in 2019 to provide solo exhibition opportunities for Chicago artists in Co-Prosperity's large windows. This year, the program launched in time to allow for artists to show their work safely and accessibly to the public during the pandemic. Each Co-Prosperity Peers exhibition comes with a \$500 stipend made possible by the Andy Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts. For the 2021 season, the council has received over 60 proposals to be reviewed. To submit a proposal for the next season, visit coprosperity.org/submit.

Li-Ming Hu's DISCOmbobulation

February 1-February 22, 2020

A combination of installation, video and performance exploring notions of authenticity in relation to cultural identities and how subjectivities are con-

structed through the experience of diaspora. The work examined the ways in which authenticity is demanded from cultural producers; artists and musicians alike. PUBLIC

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Live from the windows, renowned art historian and critic Lori Waxman wrote reviews free of charge for artists in need. Completed reviews were published in the 137th edition of Lumpen (Artist Run Chicago), and remained on view at the windows throughout the length of the show.

Anthony Sims's Body/Space

October - November 2020

In Body/Space, Sims adopts the form of a tableau vivant (a living image), creating a series of 26 performances that are unique to each of Co-Prosperity's three windows. Body/Space focuses on conscious and subconscious labeling, neglection, and interpretation of black queerness in the contemporary art world and LGBTQ+ community. By introducing shifting scenic elements and costume design, he will explore vast eras of time, beginning in the 1920s and ultimately documenting the past 100 years of black queer liberation. Reckoning with the window pane as a photographic lens, Sims aims to highlight the power of resistance in stillness.

Casey Carsel's Knobl Hearts

November 2020 - January 2021

"Though historically garlic and Jewish culture were closely intertwined (for better or for worse), garlic is rarely recognized in the present day as a cultural signifier of Jewishness (also for better or for worse). Like many historical symbols of Jewish identity, the association with garlic has disappeared, replaced by others icons and other options. Knobl Hearts (Knobl—meaning garlic in Yiddish) takes the simultaneous sweetness and stench of garlic within Jewish cultural history, as well as its relative contemporary absence, as a starting-point towards at least a small facet of a Jewish identity."

The Quarantine Times (www.quarantinetimes.org) was produced by Public Media Institute and served as a COVID-19 emergency relief fund for over 300 Chicago artists between March and August of 2020. Each day, PMI commissioned a new creative response to the pandemic, the uprising against police terror, and the breadth of hardship our communities have experienced in 2020.

QUARANTINE TIMES + MCA

November 2020 - May 2021

The Quarantine Times project was included in the MCA exhibition "The Long Dream" that opened on November 7th of 2020. The Quarantine Times installation includes posters made for the windows of PMI's headquarters, Co-Prosperity, three screens that scroll the entire contents of the web platform, and a larger screen that loops 70+ hour archive of live-streamed performances and conversations PMI has produced since the beginning of the pandemic. This screen will also display any new live content in real time.





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Lumpen Radio

LUMPEN RADIO GOES REMOTE

2020 has transformed how we live, play and learn. As challenging as 2020 has been Lumpen Radio was ready to continue amplifying and celebrating creative leaders. In March radio producers, hosts and volunteers swiftly pivoted from our studios to their homes. Not only did our active roster continue but our technology and mutual-aid network allowed for new content to surface. Lumpen Radio saw immense growth this year with 14 new shows airing amidst a pandemic, Lumpen Radio has aired 70+ hours of new content each week including expanded local news coverage, multilingual journalism, creative cultural programming for Chicago's southside. Additionally, we were able to renew our broadcasting license with the FCC for another 8 years. As we look to 2021 we look forward to strengthening our current roster of hosts and producers and continuing to diversify our multilingual content.

Communities Amplified


Communities Amplified was created to train new radio producers from communities in Chicago and expand multilingual programming on Lumpen Radio. Even while in-person workshops and access to the station were curtailed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, PMI and our stellar producers and instructors Stephanie Manriquez and Anita Luk found many different ways to bring fresh new voices in Spanish and Cantonese on the radio. CoAmp 2020 trained content creators, editors and producers. Here is a round-up:

Since the launch of the Cantonese-langauge show Tete-a-tete in late 2019, experienced producer and host Anita Luk has invited apprentices from Chicago's Chinese-american communities into the Lumpen Radio station. Two of Anita's production fellows, journalists and community organizers Grace Chan McKibben and Yury Lui, have now joined Communities Amplified to bring more Cantonese and Mandarin-language journalism and culture on Lumpen Radio.

Between April and June, Stephanie led a 6-week online production workshop with two students. This process worked as a pilot for future radio production workshops.

Meanwhile, through new Community Recording Sessions, six brilliant youth producers of Yollocalli Arts Reach recorded stories from community members and edited segments for the radio. Between July and September, Stephanie led four-to-six hour individual training sessions with six new producers and invited two veteran Lumpen Radio producers to make content for the new show CoAmp en Español WLPN.

During the last trimester of this crazy year, between October and December, CoAmp proudly launched 18 segments produced throughout the year. Of those segments, six became new monthly shows in Spanish on Lumpen Radio: "No the asustes," "De Migrante a Migrante," "Todo y Nada," and two new segments from Contratiempo Radio, "Adentro de la voy hay un poema" and Contratiempo Radio Virtual.

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


Lumpen 136 - POST NO BILLS


The 136th issue of Lumpen Magazine joined the nationwide uprising against police brutality and racial violence, triggered in 2020 by the police murders of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, and too many other African-Americans in the United States. The issue gathered essays, critiques, visual art and protest posters created by artists, writers and activists.

Lumpen 137 - Artist Run Chicago

Lumpen 137: Artists Run Chicago joined the Hyde Park Art Center in celebrating Chicago's artist-run projects. In interviews and essays with artists who run galleries and cultural spaces in Chicago, writers from Lumpen and from Sixty Inches from Center gathered profiles, characteristic histories, and pieces of advice from the community. Two maps compare the spaces that were part of the first "Artists Run Chicago" show, in 2009, and those that make up the exhibition this year. And a directory lists over a hundred artist-run projects that live in Chicago today.

Lumpen 137 also draws a picture of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on artist-run Chicago. Through graphs and stories, the magazine shows the results of a survey completed by forty-three spaces between May and August of 2020.






Participants in Artists-Run Chicago 2.0 2020

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Buddy

Buddy was set to open at the Garland Gallery in the Chicago Cultural Center on April 17, 2020.

Buddy had accepted over 200 artists from over 30 Chicago neighborhoods, was beginning to receive products, and was building out the shop space when the pandemic hit and everything was put on hold.

BUDDY 100 & COMMUNITY OF THE FUTURE MARKET

In July, we received a generous donation that has allowed Buddy to give 100% of sales to artists to the remainder of 2020. It also allowed us to finish the Cultural Center buildout and pay employees to begin to run Buddy as a pop-up at the weekly Community of the Future Market where we highlighted art and products of artists of color and generated our first sales.

WEB SHOP

With news that the Cultural Center would not open until 2021, we adapted with a new plan to open Buddy online. On September 22,





after months of work receiving and inventorying products from artists affected by the pandemic, photographing over 650 unique items, help from graphic and web designers, we launched the site at hi-buddy.org. We opened to a healthy round of online sales and continued to attend outdoor sales to promote the shop.

BUDDY PERFORMANCE AND RESEARCH RESIDENCY: RE: PLACE CHICAGO

In September, Buddy welcomed Atom-R, Santiago X, Felicia Holman, Josh Rios, and Marina Resende Santos for the inaugural Buddy Performance and Research Residency. Titled Re: Place Chicago, the first session invites works reflecting on queer and BIPOC histories of the region in consultation with historians, technology experts, and the city. The residency goes on until the fall of 2021, when artists will show their work in-person and live on Lumpen Radio and Lumpen TLVSN.

Art 2 Go

Amidst all of these changes, we found time to launch the inaugural show of Art 4 Sale, an exhibition series that will eventually have a home in the Cultural Center store. The show Art 2 Go features work from nine Chicago-based artists and projects that are designed to be taken "to go," to be completed and interacted with at home.

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Community Kitchen

The Community Kitchen is a food service program whose purpose is to employ hospitality industry workers to feed those in need. The Community Kitchen provides hot complementary box lunches to residents, families and workers in Chicago. Meals are delivered 5 days a week to food pantries, local senior housing complexes, community centers, hospital workers and residents of Chicago. The program launched on June 10th and by late July the number of meals being distributed increased from 600 to 1,000 meals per week. In effort to broaden the program's reach and provide easier access to food, The Community Canteen launched on November 12, allowing for 1,000 more meals per week.

Community Canteen is a carry-out restaurant concept that serves free lunches 5 days a week, available to everyone. The first location is located at Kimski in the neighborhood of Bridgeport. Working in tandem, the Community Kitchen and Community Canteen have served over 21,000 meals since June. In 2021 an additional Community Canteen will be established at Wherewithall restaurant and will be open four days a week.

Total meals served will increase overall to 3,600 meals per week through April, 2021.

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
